BACKGROUND

Founded in the summer of 2020 by former nonprofit professional and behavior researcher, Ngozika Egbuonu, **The Human Movement (THM)** is defined by a singular mission: **uniting communities behind positive global change**.

To accomplish this important work, Ngozika has leveraged her background in mental health, nonprofit fundraising, and environmental education and outreach to develop THM's three core programs: **truth and reconciliation**, **multimedia**, and **environmental education**, **stewardship**, and **advocacy**.

THM'S CORE PROGRAMS

- 1. **Truth and reconciliation** within local communities, institutions, and between local, state and federal governments and marginalized people;
- 2. Multimedia projects, such as the Questioning Everything podcast (QEP), that are aimed at connecting different groups, educating each other, and highlighting stories and topics important to people from every walk of life; and
- 3.Advancing conservation education and the importance of environmental stewardship and advocacy within underserved communities that are disproportionately impacted by pollution and environmental threats.

BUILDING THE MOMENTUM FOR GLOBAL CHANGE

YEAR ONE

- Recruit diverse and well-engaged board of directors from the DC, Maryland, and Virginia region and the following groups:
 - Disabilities and disability advocacy | Diversity, equity, justice, and inclusion | Education | Environmental justice and advocacy | Health and human services | Law | Multimedia/media
- Coordinate and execute debut conservation-focused 5K Walk/Run Fundraiser through our 'Trash Free Prince Georges County' program:
 - This targeted fall walk/run will include a clean-up component in the Prince Georges County area (tentatively Central Avenue between DC and Largo, MD)
 - It will also include other fundraising events and activities such as:
 - A **story slam** based on the theme of 'water'
 - Comedians, poets, musicians, and more will be invited to speak/perform (3-minute time limits for all)
 - Three-on-Three Basketball tournament and free-throw competition (kids/adults), and film screening of Basketball County: In the Water

YEAR TWO

Staffing Expansion

The focus of year two will be on greatly expanding the THM workforce from volunteers to paid staffers for the following key positions:

- Research Director (a position to be held by THM founder's husband, Gerald Odezulu, MHS [PhD candidate '21] and focused on environmental and human health reporting)
- Operations Director (in charge of bookkeeping, finance and other key responsibilities to be outlined during year one)
- Programs Director (will oversee all programs and recruitment of additional staff and volunteers to manage them)

• **Legislative/Policy Director** (in charge of all advocacy work related to conservation, environmental justice, health, and human rights)

YEAR THREE

Further Expansion of Staffing

Relying on a careful documentation of year two management and resources, THM will determine what additional staffing needs are necessary to increase the impact of our programs, new projects, and opportunities.

YEAR FOUR

Develop Blueprint for Global Programming

With three years of successful programming in the DC, Maryland, and Virginia region, THM will develop a comprehensive blueprint for developing a program in our founder's native homeland of **Nigeria**. The focus of this program will be to support women and girls in the following needs areas:

- Education and completion of secondary school, as well as support in applying to and preparing to attend college
- Assistance with entrepreneurship opportunities for women from the lowest socioeconomic status communities within Nigeria-- emphasizing artisans and agriculture
- **Family planning** support and education to further encourage women and girls to focus on scholastic and/or business enterprises

YEAR FIVE

Strategic Planning

Strategic planning for the next five years will be one of THM's main objectives. THM leadership, community contacts, program participants, board members, and more will meet regularly over a 12-month period to conduct an organizational SWOT (strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats) analysis to ensure the next five years increase impact and align with THM's mission.

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
